

IOSH MANAGING SAFELY

Who should attend?

This classroom awareness course is for individuals in a supervisory and managerial position who are responsible for the organisations' Health and Safety practices.

What will I learn?

This course will provide each candidate with the understanding of their legal responsibilities for staff under their control, identifying hazards and reducing them within the workplace through the facilitation of risk assessments and Health and Safety management systems.

Course information:

3 day duration (The course format can be modified to suit each organisation's needs).
Minimum 4 people - maximum 6 people.
No prerequisites required.

Certification:

Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH) certificate.

Course content includes:

- Safety management systems, the role of risk assessment and how safety management links with other aspects of management, legal requirements and the social environment.
- Reactive monitoring including which incidents have to be reported, checking that reports are being made, recording reported incidents, conducting investigations, recording results and analysing records.
- Risk assessment and risk control, including making an inventory of sources of hazards, identifying hazards associated with each course, rating risks, selecting workplace precautions and recording results of risk assessments and reviews.
- Preparing and using active monitoring checklists, implementing schedules for active monitoring, recording results and analysing records.
- Safety policy, organising and conducting a management review of the safety management system and preparing a health and safety audit.
- Identifying relevant legislation and obtaining advice and guidance on compliance. Managing the sources of hazards addressed in Working Safely.
